Supervising Youth Development

(Also known as AYD for Supervisors) This is a 15-hour course that introduces supervisors of frontline youth workers to youth development from a managerial perspective. It is designed to help an organization infuse a facilitative approach to supervision into organizational culture

Navigating Youth Culture

The Navigating Youth Culture training covers issues surrounding youth culture and gang culture particularly for at-risk youth populations. It provides insight into the differences between youth culture and gang culture, and discusses coding and street socialization. As a result of this training, youth workers will better understand the life experiences of youth and the importance of their roles in young people's lives.
